

About the CCAA

The Columbia County Chief's Association (CCCA) was formed by the Law Enforcement Administrators of the Columbia County Sheriff's Office, Columbia County District Attorney's Office, and the Police Departments of Wisconsin Dells, Portage, Poynette, Lodi, Wyocena, Fall River, Rio, Columbus and Randolph. The association was created to improve upon and enhance law enforcement operations and corroboration among law enforcement agencies in Columbia County. The goal is to promote effective and coordinated law enforcement services to keep Columbia County safe.

The association continues to strengthen local law enforcement with professionalism, training, ethics and leadership to better protect life and property of the citizens of Columbia County. The CCCA strives to support the local law enforcement officers and our citizens.

The association is promoting and supporting young men and women from Columbia County who want to enter into the criminal justice field. We feel that in paying it forward and supporting the educations of future law enforcement students through financial scholarships is a great way to keep the tradition of a strong ethical local law enforcement.

Columbia County Chief's Association Scholarship Program

The Columbia County Chief's Association annual scholarship award program was developed to offer financial assistance to full-time students pursuing a degree in law enforcement related field at any Wisconsin College or Technical School. Its purpose is to encourage educational growth and professionalism among police officers and deputy sheriffs in the State of Wisconsin and more specifically, Columbia County.

One, \$1,000 scholarship will be awarded and winners will be selected on a competitive basis. Any Columbia County resident that is enrolling in a Wisconsin College or Technical School, and has a course of study leading to a degree in a law enforcement related field, is eligible.

Members of this association's committee will select the scholarship recipients. All decisions made are final. The recipient must submit proof of their 2025 fall semester grades at an accredited technical school/university. Awards are not retroactive and may not be credited to semesters already completed. Recipient must be enrolled in the fall semester of 2025. After the student has submitted proof of fall semester 2025 grades, a check for the scholarship award will be given directly to the scholarship recipient.

Scholarship Rules

1. Application must comply with the requirement for the applicant to be a high school senior or continuing college student who is enrolled as a full-time student in a Criminal Justice related program at a college or technical school in the State of Wisconsin and is a resident of Columbia County or attending a Columbia County High School.

2. TO APPLY:

- a. Fill out and submit the attached Scholarship Application in its entirety.
- b. Enclose three (3) letters of recommendation from three separate sources, which may include family members, school, neighbor, clergy, employer, civic organization, law enforcement, etc.
- c. Enclose an official transcript of your high school and / or college grades.
- d. Enclose a recent photo.
- e. Additional information as may be attached as appropriate.
- f. Scholarship applications must be postmarked no later than March 10th, 2025 and mailed to:

- 3. Once selected, scholarship recipients will receive the monetary award after submitting their first semester grades for the fall of 2025 by January 31st, 2026.
- 4. Failure to comply with instructions will result in ineligibility.
